GUEST PRESENTATION "Voluntourism"

Jim Lewell is a longtime Christina Lake resident and former educator who travels to Nicaragua as a respresentative of the Grand Forks United Church to assist in areas of extreme poverty. He presented an informative powerpoint that shed light on the incredible poverty and struggles of families in rural Nicaragua. As he plans his trip for 2023 his focus is on providing education to children of the Jicalillo, Padre Ramos and Los Zorros areas. He is seeking \$4,000 for his 2023 humanitarian trip. One hundred percent of the proceeds reach the intended recipients.
